Executive Summary

This report covers project activities under taken during the time period of April, May & June, 2022 of "Continuation of Education for Afghan Refugees in Hosting Areas Khyber Pakhtunkhwa". The main objective of this Project Final Report is to document the progress made in the implementation of the project and to record positive results that have been achieved during this period. The project within the span of only 03 months has achieved more that 99.9% of planned targets. The project of "Continuation of Education for Afghan Refugees in Hosting Areas Khyber Pakhtunkhwa" was comprised of following different activities.

- School assessment survey was conducted to identify out-of-school and vulnerable children and of school facilities in 66 schools in target areas in close coordination with local school teachers, religious and Community Leaders.
- capacity building of 194 Teachers on PTC, Health & Hygiene and MHPSS of 126 schools/ALPCs (66 schools and 60 ALPCs) in the Afghan Refugee Hosting area of targeted four districts of KPK.

- The PTC training included formation of PTC, Development of School Improvement Plan (SIP) on approved register and sensitization on PTC role and responsibilities. The Health and Hygiene club consist of formation of H&H on approved format, regular meetings and their record keeping, training on their role and responsibilities and play active role to strengthen the H&H activities at school and community level.
- The ISU DoE &SE-KP provided teaching learning supplies to the teachers and students in order to enhance their interest towards quality education. 17500 Students) including Pakistani) were facilitated by providing Education supplies.
- Facilitated/monitored 12322 students regarding health screening and ensured issuing of referral card to 2080 Students.

The ISU DoE &SE-KP developed close coordination with all stakeholders through sharing progress reports, work plan, and supplies distribution plans. UNICEF were also updated Regularly through Progress reports and progress sharing meetings.





Major Achievements:

Facilitated continuation of educational opportunities for 17,510 Students.

Improved working capacities and involvement of (528) PTC members in the schools' affairs by organizing 66 meetings.

Improved capacities of 66 head teachers of 66 targeted schools on conducting meetings with PTCs and how to take meeting minutes.

01 STEP

Enhanced awareness of the local communities' members of 04 targeted districts through conducting meetings regarding importance of education.

03 STEP

Improved working capacities of 132 teachers. 60 ALP Facilitators on improved teaching methodologies, learning friendly environment and class room management Roles & Responsibilities of PTCs, formation of Health & Hygiene clubs.

05 STEP

Improved health & hygiene condition of 17,510 Students though conducting regular health & hygiene session in 66 selected schools by the Health & Hygiene Club members.



Project Inception Workshop

The orientation workshop of the project Continuation of Education for Children in Afghan Refugees Hosting Areas in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa at conference hall of ISU DoE& SE-KP. The workshop was attended by 26 participants from All the relevant stakeholders and newly hired staff participated in the workshop. These were included representative UNICEF, DEOs of Male female of the targeted Districts, NCHD, Director Elementary and

Secondary Education Department-KP and newly hired staff of ISU DoE SE-KP. This workshop served as a consensus building point amongst various stakeholders for their increased support and cooperation during the project implementation. The project targeted 04 Districts where the project is going to be implement were also discussed. Briefing about the background of the project and the situation of afghan children were also disused.





School Assessment

\For the achievement of goals and work at grass root level in afghan Refugee Host areas UNICEF has selected the ISU DoE & SE-KP as an implementing partner due to its vast relevant experience in the same in the KP province. ISU started its interventions in four selected Districts i.e Kohat, Peshawar, Haripur and Manshera.

Initially assessment was made to identify out of school children. Need of teaching learning supplies and capacity needs of the teachers in 66 schools of targeted Districts.

As per the data of Baseline assessment conducted by ISU DoE & SE-KP in the month of April, 2022, The overall objective of the school assessment survey was to conduct a situational analysis of schools and communities in Peshawar, Haripur, Manshera and Kohat where Refugee families were living with host families and communities. The survey adopted both the quantitative and qualitative approach which was based on a questionnaire/format based survey of schools and Focus Group Discussions (FGDs) with host community members, afghan, members of PTCs, afghan's children, teachers and the officials of education department. The

school assessment survey was conducted 66 schools located in 04 Districts of KP.

The summary of key findings is presented below:

- Out of the total 66 schools were of boys and 37 of girls 23 and 40 were located in urban areas and 116 in rural areas.
- A total 15500 children in which 4396 (including afghan) were enrolled in the 66 schools with 2225 (28%) boys and 1925 (46%) girls. On average there were 66 Refugee children in one school.
- There were 28% Refugee children in surveyed schools while 78% host children.
- About 95% of the surveyed schools had functional buildings with 2-3 rooms and 98% of the schools had toilet facility.
- Almost half (49%) of the surveyed schools were over-crowded as results of increasing number of Refugees children.
- In about 60% of the surveyed schools their existed potential for organizing evening classes for increasing access to education to Refugee children.

Based on the results of the survey following recommendations were made:







- The schools should be equipped with additional facilities and infrastructure in order to fulfil the educational needs of the Refugee children.
- The capacity of teachers on MHPSS, Health & Hygiene and members of PTCs should be enhanced.
- The students and teachers should be equid with teaching learning supplies.
- Emergency preparedness should be

enhanced at school level.

• There is need for strong community involvement for enrolling the out of school refugees children.

Based on the recommendations of the assessment, ISU DoE & SE-PK designed project activities in order to facilitate afghan Refugee Children who are residing in the host areas of District Kohat, Peshwar, Haripur and Manshera.








Teachers Training on PTC, Health & Hygiene and MHPSS

Keeping in view the persisting issues of lack of teachers, untrained teachers, quality education, corporal punishment, addressing all the aspects of child development and lack of awareness regarding psychosocial support teaching methodologies, according to the various learning styles of the children. address all these issues, quality in education, capacity building of teachers was kept as an essential component of the intervention to improve the quality of education through awareness of teachers, regarding latest concepts, teaching pedagogies, child psychology, child development aspects and elements of quality in education, which can have a substantive and longer term impact. In this perspective, Teachers Training on Parent Teacher Council (PTC), Mental Health & Psycho Social Support (MHPSS) and Emergency Preparedness (First Aid). All the above mentioned issues identify by the staff of ISU DoE& SE-KP by conducting TNA in these 66 Schools. After the TNA the ISU DoE & SE-KP engaged its Professional trainers for conducting the trainings. These trainers build the capacity of 194(136 Primary School Teacher, 60 ALP Facilitators) teachers through 5-Days Teachers Training. The 5-days teachers training covered a variety of topics; the first two days concentrated on essentials mental health and Psycho Social Support, Psychological Frist Aid, and Health and Hygiene relating to children. On the third day, the trainer guides the teacher about the role and responsibilities of Parent teacher council-PTCs. The last two days of training focused on Emergency preparedness as well as disaster risk reduction.






Distribution of Teaching Learning Supplies

The situation of schools was also not satisfactory even before arrival of Afghan Children was worst after the enrolment of afghan children. In the absence of basic school supplies i.e. school books, note books; recreational material and other school supplies children became drop out whereas the situation of school is also a bearer of enrolment of out of

school children. One of the major issues was lack of capacity of the teachers.


Keeping in mind the above mentioned worst situation of schools and to facilitate the Afghan Children, the ISU DoE SE –KP provided teaching learning Supplies (Detail is below) to 15510 Students. In order to ensure usage of UNICEF Teaching Learning supplies The field staff were provided orientation on UNICEF Supplies. Below chart Shows the Detail of District supplies.





Facilitation/Monitoring of NCHD for Health screening

ISU DoE & SE-KP facilitated/ Monitored the health screening process which was conducted by the NCHD in the targeted Districts. The Basic objective of the Health Screening is to tackle the growing burden of Non-Communicable Diseases in Pakistan to identify students with visual, hearing, dental, skin and personal hygiene problems through simple and scientific screening techniques. The Trained staff of NCHD screened 12322 out of 17500 and 2080 reffered to health facility for further treatment.





Monitoring and Evaluation

Monitoring and evaluation was conducted throughout the project duration, by the Project Management Unit headed by the Director Programs, Project Coordinator and M & E Officer was responsible for day to day monitoring of the project activities with the support of project staff. Field staff were responsible in facilitating the monitoring at local level, teachers also contribute to monitoring and evaluation by providing feedback on the overall implementation of the programme, as well as on trainers' performance and quality of training. They submit final evaluations after participating in Trainings.

Reporting mechanism were developed for proper documentation, which were as followed;

Activity Reports; reports were prepared for each activity, performed during the course of implementation of the project.

Weekly Progress Reports; covering activities, implemented during a week,

Monthly Progress Report; covering the activities conducted during the whole month.

Final Report; a comprehensive report was prepared, depicting whole learning and experiences of the project



Obstacles Encountered And Mitigation

The local community of the targeted districts were very conservative. ISU DoE & SE-KP really struggled to ensure the gender balance in its activities. The community members of few villages in the target areas objected the movement of female's staff in some of the field sites the female teachers and PTC members were not allowed by their families to go to the meetings arranged for them.

ISU DoE & SE-KP organization faced challenge at times in the field to implement project activities due to security situation and cultural constraints for women gatherings; however, its field staff was provided by skilled training to

overcome with these issues through sensitizing meetings with Authorities and working closely with PTCs.

In some cased parents were not willing to send their girl children to school. ISU DoE & SE-KP focussed its energies to those communities through holding community meetings with Ulamas and local leaders.

The project duration but all the target schools got closed on June on account of summer vacations as a result, it was quite challenging to complete all the project activities like follow-up of teachers, conduct of regular meeting etc. Project team worked closely with all stakeholders to re-schedule activities



Recommendations

- · Continuation of awareness raising activities such as village level seminars and meeting with local key stakeholders on children right to education.
- Enrolment campaign to ensure maximum enrolment in the target schools.
- School based activities which could easily ensure the participation of children and teachers.
- Capacity enhancement of the District Education Departments
- Early Childhood Education Should be initiated in the area
- Additional Teachers for ECE should be provided in the schools
- Capacity building of teachers on class room management, Child friendly schools should be include in future projects.

- Capacity building of Education department should be include in future programs
- For keeping the active role of PTCs, and youth champions a sustainable may be formed to facilitate regular organizations of the members by equipping them in communication skills, motivational skills, conflict resolution and positive friendly environment, peace and tolerance.
- It is recommended to replicate child friendly school (CFS) approach.
- An additional room for newly enrolled children is recommended in the schools of the target areas. PTCs should be provided skill based trainings for their livelihood
- More teachers training on different topics is also recommended for future intervention
